# Dick's Brewing Company to celebrate 30th anniversary this year

Dick's Brewing Company has come a long way in the 30 years since Richard "Dick" Young opened the business in 1994, in the back room of his already-renowned meat company Northwest Sausage

business in its own right, producing an average of about 100 barrels a month for sale across six states and hosting a wide variety of events at its tasting room in Centralia.

"It's always fun to think about what (Young) would have thought with ... how busy

Young ran the brewery behind Northwest Sausage & Deli from 1994 to 2008, when he moved the company to its current location in a warehouse on Galvin Road.

"When we built this and moved here, he didn't even think about selling beer here. It was all just supposed to be production," Dick's Brewing Company Co-Owner Dave Pendleton said. "And then, all of a sudden, he's like, 'Wait, why don't we have people come in here?' Because we were all drinking beer here after work, and he was like, 'Yeah, people can come in and join us." Dick's Brewing Company opened its tasting room inside the Galvin Road warehouse in 2009 as a fridge with three taps on it. Young didn't get to see

# Will a third time "charm" the Legislature to create permanent funding solution for rural fire districts?

Over the past four years as a state representative, I toured numerous fire stations and districts on the front line protecting our communities. I represent diverse communities in the Legislative District including parts of Thruston, Lewis, Cowlitz, and Clark counties. Each county has had

emergencies like heat waves, cold snaps, flooding, and fires. In each case, our professional full-time and volunteer firefighters were among the first responders protecting our citizens.

There are some communities with the financial means, tax base, and property values to pass ballot measures that support the

needs of our first responders. However, many other communities are unable to pass ballot measures for one reason

or another. This puts their neighbors at risk and increases insurance costs for those who can least afford it.

Several communities in Lewis County are perfect examples where working families and fixed-income households can't absorb additional tax increases. But, those same households deserve to be protected.

In the Chehalis Basin, I saw first-hand the need for additional facility funding as we set up temporary shelters at Centralia Middle School during flood evacuations. In Packwood during the Goat Rocks fire, I witnessed

Chehalis's new city manager has spent his first month in office hard at work meeting with city staff and citizens to determine where best to focus his attention going forward.

"I've been able to answer a lot of questions for a lot of people and, I think, for the most part, I've been able to kickstart some of the things that people have been complaining about, that they were saying the city was dragging their feet on," said Stacy Denham, referring to citizen's concerns about building and construction permit delays.

Denham officially started his new role as Chehalis city manager on June 1.

He has lived in the Chehalis area for over 30 years and was

employed as a Chehalis police officer for over 12 years before being hired by the Centralia Police Department in 2006. He started in Centralia as a police officer and progressed through the ranks, serving as a sergeant, commander and deputy chief, then as police chief from 2020 to 2024.

"I really do feel back at home in Chehalis," Denham said. "I do feel that the city here has accepted me like I'm coming back home ... It just feels like this is a very natural fit for me, and it's kind of (like) this is the place I'm supposed to be."

The city manager serves as the chief administrative officer for the city, providing executive leadership and representation on all matters concerning city government, the City of Chehalis states on its website.

In addition to meeting with Chehalis citizens, Denham has spent his first month on the job meeting with city employees, with the goal of having 30-minute one-on-one conversations with each staff

member.

"They're the ones doing the work," Denham said of city staff. "So that's kind of the first step for me."

The second step, he said, is to apply everything he learned from staff to the city's procedures and policies to make sure they're serving staff and citizens the way that they should.

Once that's taken care of, Denham said, "I'm going to have a little bit more time to start leaning into other issues that the city may be having, challenges the city's faced with, and get the city more or less moving again."

The Chehalis City Manager's Office is open 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday at 350 N. Market Blvd., Room 101, in Chehalis. The office can be reached at 360-345-1042.

# Lincoln Creek Lumber finds long term success communityfocused business model

A family-owned lumber yard serving Lewis and Thurston counties for over 100 years, Lincoln Creek Lumber is devoted to providing quality products for many more years to come.

The business currently has four locations collectively owned by the fifth generation of Thompsons, Bob Thompson Jr.

"The reason we've been around for 100 years is because we try to give very good service at a really reasonable rate and support the community," Thompson said.

Lincoln Creek Lumber, Thompson said, is "basically a full service lumber yard and hardware store, so basically (we sell) anything to build a house."

Lincoln Creek Lumber is also a member of the Ace Hardware co-op, which allows the hardware store aspect of the business to sell hardware products at a competitive price.

Lincoln Creek Lumber began as a mill in Lincoln Creek Valley in the Galvin area in 1903. The mill went out of business during the Great Depression, but the family kept their business alive by reselling milled materials, Thompson said.

choosing to continue operating as a reseller.

In about 1941, Lincoln Creek Lumber moved from the Galvin area to its current location on what is now Harrison Avenue, where it still stands today.

"We were way outside of town at that point, but now it's part of town," Thompson said.

Around the same time, Lincoln Creek Lumber purchased Palmer Lumber in Chehalis. Palmer Lumber kept its name but has been run by Lincoln Creek Lumber since the '40s.

Lincoln Creek Lumber built its second location in the Tumwater area in the early 1990s, and has since opened a hardware store in downtown Chehalis.

"We pride ourselves on the limber side of getting a high quality product," Thompson said, adding that the business' lumber clientele are usually custom builders working on large products, such as apartment buildings and housing complexes.

The family was later able to purchase and resell mill stock from other businesses.

"We just started buying and selling material that had already been milled. That's how we became a reseller," Thompson said.

The family chose not to reopen the mill after the Depression ended, instead

exhausted firefighters from local, state, and federal agencies sleeping on the ground. Families evacuated from their homes due to forest fires were moved to a school gym.

Some emergencies in Lewis County, like the Goat Rocks fire, occurred 80 miles from the nearest large city in the county. Rural communities don't have the resources or facilities to fight these natural disasters on their own but are on the front-line protecting communities.

Not all scenarios were as dramatic.

Some communities struggle to keep up with growth quickly pinching rural communities. Other communities are seeing fire department facilities deteriorating from age. In

"Thank you to everyone for supporting us for all these years, for coming into the store and supporting local businesses, because that's what makes a community like ours strong," Thompson said.

these cases, fire districts need the resources to protect communities. Also, without adequate facilities and staff to keep communities safe, many already struggling small businesses and working families are forced to pay higher insurance rates.

As the ranking member on the House Capital Budget Committee, I immediately began researching grants and funding dedicated to building and maintaining fire district facilities. I wanted to help fire departments create training centers, cooling/warming stations, evacuation points, and a front-line for combating forest fires. Sadly, there wasn't a grant program dedicated to fire district infrastructure funding.

In my first term in the Legislature, I pre-field House Bill 1929 to establish a competitive grant program under the state Department of Commerce to award up to \$2 million to local governments in rural counties for capital projects that would improve fire protection services. Unfortunately, the bill never received a hearing.

Despite the lack of a hearing, I was proud to fight for funding in the capital budget for fire districts. Although capital budget investments were made in the 2021-2022 legislative session, it did not meet the need and I continued to advocate for a permanent dedicated grant program.

In 2023, I refiled the bill as House Bill 1014. The legislation received a hearing in the House Capital Budget Committee but was not given an executive session vote. Again, the capital budget

funded numerous fire district projects; however, it did not meet the demand and no permanent funding source was created.

You know what they say, "Third time's a charm."

This fall, I will again re-file the rural fire district funding legislation with a new house bill number. I am confident with your help and support we will pass this policy, improve fire safety, and help absorb some of the fire safety costs to relieve the economic burden on working families and small businesses.


