Eight Decades of Excellence: Althausen Rayan Abbarno, LLP, Celebrates 80 Years

For 80 years, Althausen Rayan Abbarno, LLP, has been far more than a law firm. It has become an institution in Lewis County by helping individuals and businesses navigate life’s most important decisions while building a legacy of integrity, professionalism, mentorship, and community service.

Founded in 1946 by Dale M. Nordquist and D.D. (Donald) Schnatterly, the firm opened its doors in downtown Centralia during the years following World War II. Southwest Washington was experiencing tremendous growth fueled by the timber, railroad, agriculture, and manufacturing industries, creating a need for trusted legal counsel. The founders quickly earned a reputation for providing exceptional legal representation while becoming active leaders in their community.

That tradition of public service began with Nordquist himself. Beyond his successful legal career, he served as a Washington State Senator before becoming a Lewis County Superior Court Judge. His dedication to both the legal profession and public service established values that continue to guide the firm today.

As the firm grew, a new generation of attorneys strengthened that foundation. Ralph Olson became known

throughout Lewis County as a trusted counselor, respected attorney, and dedicated mentor. Olson believed attorneys should be active members of their communities, giving generously of their time through Rotary, education initiatives, and numerous charitable organizations. His commitment helped shape a culture where service became just as important as legal expertise.

Another attorney whose influence continues today is T. Charles “Chuck” Althausen. Joining the firm in the late 1970s, he spent more than four decades building one of Southwest Washington’s premier legal practices before

retiring in 2018. His work in real estate, business law, personal injury, and civil litigation earned statewide respect. Locally, Althausen served and volunteered with Centralia Rotary, Centralia High School Dollars for Scholars, and many other civic organizations. Perhaps his greatest contribution was mentoring the next generation of attorneys, teaching them that preparation, integrity, and respect for every client are the true hallmarks of a successful lawyer.

That commitment to developing future leaders remains central to the firm’s philosophy today.

The firm’s current partners

Todd Rayan, Peter Abbarno, Jakob McGhie, and Kathryn Eyraud bring unique legal expertise while carrying forward the values established by the firm’s founders.

Todd Rayan, who grew up in nearby Rochester, joined the firm in 2003 and became a partner just three years later. His practice focuses on complex civil litigation, personal injury, and wrongful death cases. In particular, Rayan enjoys serving multiple generations of the same families, something he says reflects the long-term relationships the firm has built throughout the community. Although technology allows attorneys to work remotely,

Rayan appreciates being together in the office. “We could work from home,” Rayan says, “but coming to the office is a choice. It’s like coming in to hang out with family.”

Peter Abbarno is widely recognized throughout Southwest Washington for his public service as State Representative for the 20th Legislative District and his years serving on the Centralia City Council, including as Mayor Pro Tem. Abbarno joined the firm in 2010 and became a partner in 2013. His legal practice focuses on serving injured workers and those injured in automobile collisions. Abbarno is often recognized for his community services volunteering with the Boys and Girls Club, local school districts, United Way of Lewis County, Special Olympics, and the Miss Lewis County Scholarship Program ... to name a few. “Our law firm has a culture of community service and giving back,” added Abbarno. “We value volunteerism and want to see our staff; our clients; and our community be successful.”

Jakob McGhie joined the firm in 2014 and became a partner in 2023. McGhie’s practice includes criminal defense, workers’ compensation, landlord-tenant law, and civil litigation. Active in numerous civic

The Southwest Washington Fair: A Tradition Worth Preserving

From August 11–16, families from across Southwest Washington will gather once again for one of our region’s most treasured traditions,

the Southwest Washington Fair. This year’s theme, “Ride Into History – America’s 250th Year,” celebrates the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence while honoring the history, agriculture, and

communities that make our region special.

For many of us, the Fair is where memories are made. It’s where children proudly show the animals they have spent months raising through 4-H and FFA, where neighbors reconnect over fair food, where local businesses showcase their products, and where families create traditions that span generations.

The Southwest Washington Fair’s roots stretch back to the late 1800s, when local agricultural fairs showcased the region’s farming communities. Recognizing the importance of creating a permanent regional fair, the Washington State Legislature passed legislation in 1909 establishing the Southwest Washington Fair Commission and providing funding for a

fairground between Centralia and Chehalis. The first Southwest Washington Fair opened later that year, making it the only fair in Washington created through an act of the Legislature to serve Southwest Washington. More than a century later, it continues to welcome families from throughout the region and remains one of Washington’s premier agricultural fairs. That regional mission remains just as important today.

Each year, more than 65,000 visitors attend the six-day event, supporting local hotels, restaurants, retailers, and countless small businesses while celebrating the agricultural and industrial heritage of Southwest Washington. The fairgrounds also serve the community year-round, hosting youth activities,

educational programs, community events, and emergency response functions.

As your State Representative and Assistant Ranking Member on the House Capital Budget Committee, I have been proud to support investments that help preserve and improve facilities serving communities across our state, including our regional fairs.

Just recently, we’ve been able to help modernize facilities, improve accessibility, and preserve historic buildings. The Southwest Washington Fair has benefited from these partnerships, including major restorations to the 4-H Barn, roof replacements, water infrastructure improvements, and investments to begin planning new equestrian facilities. These investments help ensure the fairground remains safe, functional, and welcoming for future generations.

Those improvements are about much more than buildings. They strengthen opportunities for young people to learn responsibility through 4-H and FFA, provide gathering spaces for community organizations, and preserve an institution

For generations of Lewis County residents, Nelson’s Furniture has been a familiar name. What began as a neighborhood hardware store has evolved into one of the area’s longest-standing family-owned furniture businesses, known for quality products, friendly service, and expert craftsmanship.

Originally established by Tom and Patti Nelson in 1981, the business first opened on Harrison Avenue as a True Value Hardware store. Among the store’s inventory was furniture handcrafted by a local woodworker, planting the seed for what would eventually become Nelson’s Just Wood Furniture.

As customer demand grew, the Nelsons shifted their focus from hardware to furniture, eventually transitioning the business into Nelson’s Just Wood Furniture. Nearly 30 years later, the store expanded once again, embracing a wider selection of styles that included the upholstered furniture customers were seeking while continuing to offer the solid wood craftsmanship that built its reputation.

Today, the business is operated by Tom’s son, Nick Nelson, with Tom still actively involved in the day-to-day operations. Together they continue the family’s commitment to offering quality furniture, popular styles, and prices that fit a variety of budgets.

“Our lowest prices are during Labor Day weekend and other holiday sales,” Nick said. “If you’re looking for the best deal,

those are great times to shop.”

In addition to sofas, recliners, and other upholstered pieces, Nelson’s Furniture carries dining sets, bedroom furniture, mattresses, bookshelves, coffee tables, desks, bar stools, and a wide variety of home furnishings.

One feature that continues to set Nelson’s apart is its selection of unfinished wood furniture. Customers can choose pieces and have them professionally finished to their preferred color or stain. Every piece is finished in-house by Nick, who has developed a reputation for his craftsmanship. The store also offers furniture repair services, helping customers restore cherished pieces rather than replace them.

Like many family businesses, Nelson’s has adapted over the years. At one time the store employed as many as six people. Today, Nick and Tom manage the showroom while two additional employees handle furniture assembly and deliveries.

“My hope is to focus more on the finishing work and

eventually have someone else take over the front desk so Dad can retire,” Nick said.

Shopping at Nelson’s Furniture is intentionally relaxed. Rather than a high-pressure sales environment, customers are greeted with a friendly welcome and encouraged to browse at their own pace. Knowledgeable staff are always available to answer questions, but shoppers are free to explore without feeling pressured.

The business has also recently expanded its services by becoming an authorized U-Haul dealer. Customers can now

conveniently reserve moving trucks while shopping for their furniture needs.

This year they are celebrating their 45th anniversary. After more than four decades of serving the community, Nelson’s Furniture continues to prove that personalized service, family values, and quality craftsmanship never go out of style.

Nelson’s Furniture is located at 1601 S. Gold Street in Centralia. The showroom is open Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and is closed on Sundays.

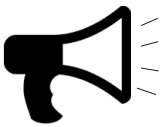
